Fungal Infection and Homoeopathic Treatment and Management

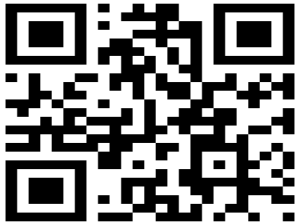

1. Sulphur

Intense itching and burning Worse from heat and washing Red, inflamed skin

2. Graphites

Thick, cracked skin Sticky discharge
Fungal infection behind ears or in folds

3. Sepia

Ring-shaped lesions

Hormonal or stress-related fungal issues
Often prescribed in women

4. Arsenicum album

Burning pain relieved by warmth
Restlessness

Recurrent infections

5. Tellurium

Ring-shaped lesions with offensive odor
Clear circular fungal patches

6. Silicea Nail fungus

Brittle, deformed nails Weak immunity

Aphorism 9

“In the healthy human state, the spirit-like vital force (dynamis)... governs the material body with unbounded sway, and retains all parts of the organism in admirable, harmonious, vital operation...”

This implies that health (including immune balance) depends on the harmonious action of the vital force.

Aphorism 11

“When a person falls ill, it is only this spirit-like, self-acting (automatic) vital force... that is primarily deranged by the dynamic influence of a morbid agent...”

Here Hahnemann suggests that 5 inflammation, fever, immune reactions) are expressions of this disturbance.

Aphorism 29 (very relevant to immunity)

Hahnemann explains that the organism produces symptoms as a defensive reaction to disease — which parallels the modern understanding of the immune response as the body's attempt to restore balance.

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
